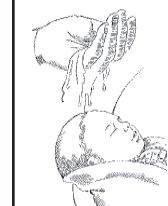

Inclement Weather Policy 2013-2014



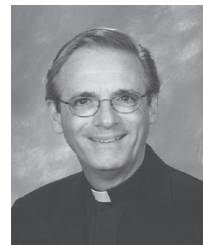
If Harford County Schools are **closed or delayed** due to snow, ice, or inclement weather Monday-Friday, **6:30 am Mass is cancelled**. We will celebrate the 8:30 am Mass. Check the parish website for updated information.

Also, if schools are closed due to snow, ice, or inclement weather, **ALL** parish meetings, functions and classes are **cancelled** that day and evening.

If there is snow or ice, or the prediction of snow or ice, during Adoration time on Tuesdays, **Adoration** will be suspended for that day.

This policy is now in effect to ensure the safety of parishioners and to allow for the proper cleaning of snow and ice from lots.

From Father Mike



Dear Friends,
Today I am continuing the comments I began last week on Christmas here at Saint Margaret.

As is our tradition, our parish provided for many families in special need at Christmas. We call this the Christmas Project. Here are some of the facts which, of course, do not tell the real human stories that lie underneath.

- 369 families assisted – including clothing, toys, household items, and food or food certificates
- 278 of these families assisted through the Giving Tree – parishioners purchase, wrap and give specific gifts needed by individuals and then the Project leaders match and combine these with the needs of others in the same family so as to care for the entire family
- 91 of these families adopted – individuals, families, or groups within the parish adopt an entire family and supply all identified needs and gifts
- 1,158 individuals assisted
- 557 adults
- 601 children
- \$9,065 of grocery store gift cards
- \$3,930 of retail store gift cards
- 125 snack plates to Meals on Wheels
- 300 stuffed-animal bears for nursing homes
- 100 persons helped through Sheriff's Office
- 150 parishioners (approximately) involved in the organizing, sorting, and delivery of gifts and food
- Various organizations and agencies helped, such as John Archer, the Alliance and the ARC

I also want to note again this year that one parish family, led by its matriarch, continues to coordinate this entire project. They are an outstanding example of responding to Matthew 25 where Jesus tells us that we care for him when we care for the least of our brothers and sisters. I thank them and all who participated in any way to make the Christmas Project happen and to enable those in need to experience the love of Christ in this special season.

Our total Christmas giving has amounted to \$115,159. Thank you very much for this. Many of you responded to my request for a \$100 gift to the parish at Christmas. Some gave more than that. I also recognize that some cannot give as much but did give what is appropriate for their circumstances. I am grateful to all of you for your generosity. This enables us to do the multiple dimensions of spiritual ministry that are the heart of our identity as a parish.

Speaking of money, our parish operating budget for the year is \$3,200,000. For the first six months, through December 31, we are operating in balance. In a month or so, I will give a fuller update on finances.

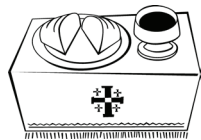

A look at the Creed The power of ONE

"I believe in one God..." And so begins the *Nicene Creed*.

Belief in one God is not a concept that began with Christianity. Jesus would have learned the Hebrew prayer "Shema Yisrael" as a young Jewish boy. "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone." (Deut 6:4) Written around the 7th century B.C., this passage from Deuteronomy clearly commands the people of Israel to profess belief in **one** God.

Jesus and his fellow Jews would have studied and meditated on Isaiah 45:22, "Turn to me and be saved, all you ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other."

The beliefs expressed in the passage from Isaiah and in the opening to the "Shema Yisrael" were in sharp contrast to those held by the surrounding nations, who proclaimed many gods, as well as worship of kings and emperors.

In the face of multiple and conflicting claims on our lives, the Jewish and Christian confidence in one God is as essential today as it was in ancient times. Our belief that one absolute authority is the foundation for all reality gives us confidence that there is an order and purpose to our seemingly chaotic universe.

Liturgy Corner clarification:

In the Liturgy Corner article of 12/29, there was mention of Pope Pius X and his consolidation of the octaves of the church year. He was canonized in 1954 and is now officially referred to as Pope St. Pius X. A hat tip to an astute parishioner!

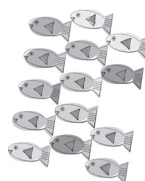
