

Over 185 children gathered to prepare for the sacrament by practicing church hymns with Teresa Newberry and Jeff Winfield. They sang "This Little Light of Mine," "Marching in the Light of God," and "I Am the Bread of Life." After the music session, the children rotated around stations that included tasting the unconsecrated host and wine, making banners and learning about what it means to be Catholic. From Father Mike



Dear Friends,
Our Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night was very special. It continued our tradition here at Saint Margaret of having a significant number of persons enter full communion with the Catholic Church. This year a total of 22 were received into full communion, including 15 adults and 7 children or teens. There are 3 other candidates who will be received into the Church within several weeks, bringing the total to 25. I congratulate all of these newly initiated Catholics and look forward to their being active participants in our Saint Margaret community.

The preparation of those interested in becoming Catholic or in completing their sacramental initiation into the Church happens through our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) and RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) programs. I am very grateful to our entire team of catechists, sponsors, and hospitality ministers. Those who have experienced these programs have shared with me over the years how much they have profited from them. Our program of becoming a Catholic has multiple components: educational, formational, relational and community-building. This rich program happens because of the commitment, faith and sharing of the entire team of staff and parishioners. I thank all who give of themselves to make this happen.

I want to take this opportunity to ask each one of you to be alert to inviting others to become part of our RCIA. This experience is designed 1) for those who are not Catholic, either unbaptized or baptized in another Christian denomination, 2) for those originally baptized Catholic but who were never really raised in the faith, 3) for baptized Catholics who have stopped practicing and now wish to renew their faith, and 4) for practicing Catholics who have never received Confirmation or just want to deepen

their faith. Our RCIA is a welcoming and enriching experience. Please consider this for yourself or encourage someone you think would benefit from it.

I want to say thanks to many of you who contributed your time and talent in making our Holy Week liturgies so beautiful:

- To the Liturgy Resource and to the Worship and Prayer Committees for all the planning of rituals and environments for these days, for assisting in making the liturgies flow so prayerfully, for decorating the spaces so beautifully (church, Callahan Center, hall and chapel) and for scheduling the many ministers needed for all of this.
- To our organists, pianists, other instrumentalists and leaders of song.
- To our adult choir which assisted at each of the services of the Triduum, in addition to the usual Mass on both Palm and Easter Sundays.
- To our Handbell Choirs.
- To our Contemporary Music Group that is bringing such new life to our 11:00 am Mass at the Callahan Center.
- To our inspiring Children's Choir.
- To our lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and ushers.
- To our altar servers and sacristans.
- To our youth who so inspiringly dramatized the Stations of the Cross.

Hundreds of you are involved in liturgical ministry in some way. I thank all of you.

Finally, we will be evaluating our Holy week and Easter experience in various settings. I invite you to share your observations. You can do this by phone, email, written notes or personal conversation (parish contact information is on the back of this bulletin). We aim for a liturgical celebration and environment that will be as spiritually enriching as possible. The peace and hope of this Easter Season to all of you!

Then and Now

How did our Scripture readings find their way into the Lectionary?

John Gaughan, a member of our Saint Margaret faith family, explained the progression quite succinctly for a Lector Workshop.

First, an event occurred that revealed God's presence. This event, in its retelling, became part of the oral tradition of our spiritual ancestors.

To prevent losing it, this oral tradition became part of the written tradition.

Over time, this written tradition was distilled to an essential truth as edited tradition.

As these truths were recognized as part of a coherent pattern, they became part of the official canon (recognized Scripture) of our faith.

The canon of the books to be included in the Bible was finalized during the Council of Trent – an ecumenical council of bishops which lasted from 1545 to 1563! But it took the Second Vatican Council to expand the prominence of Scripture in the liturgy, and, finally, in 1970 (five years after Vatican II) the present lectionary was approved.

“Sacred Scripture is the speech of God as it is put down in writing under the breath of the Holy Spirit.” Dei Verbum, CCC 81.
