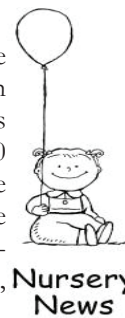
### Employment Opportunity

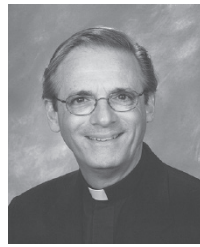

### From Father Mike



Dear Friends,  
Last week's bulletin contained a two-page flier about the *Fortnight for Freedom*.

This 14-day period (a fortnight) runs from June 21 to July 4 and is devoted to religious freedom and its protection. A similar observance took place one year ago. The Catholic bishops of the United States promote this because of challenges to religious freedom. They carefully note that religious freedom is not just freedom of worship, but also freedom to live in accord with one's moral beliefs.

The bishops cite the following, among others, as threats to religious freedom:

- A provision in the Affordable Care Act that requires nearly all employers to provide in their health plans coverage for contraception, sterilization, and abortion-inducing drugs. Churches have been given an exemption from this and an accommodation has been offered for religiously-sponsored organizations such as hospitals, universities, and social service agencies. The bishops have found the latter accommodation to be unacceptable.

- Several states have made it virtually impossible for Catholic Charities to continue adoption or foster care services because of its refusal to place children with same-sex couples or unmarried opposite-sex couples who live together.

This Tuesday our weekly Eucharistic Adoration in the chapel will be devoted to prayer for respect for the religious freedom of all. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has established an Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty and this is chaired by our Archbishop, Archbishop William Lori.

**As we announced last weekend, Archbishop Lori is here with us today to celebrate the 10:30 am Mass.** The Archbishop simply wanted to visit Saint Margaret and celebrate one of regular Sunday Masses. He does this

throughout the Archdiocese, and I am happy to welcome him here today.

**Archbishop Lori has been our spiritual shepherd for a little over a year,** being installed as the sixteenth Archbishop of Baltimore in May 2012. He was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Washington in 1977. After serving as an associate pastor in Landover, Maryland, he held a number of Archdiocesan positions including priest secretary to Cardinal James Hickey, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. He was ordained auxiliary bishop of Washington in 1995. In 2001, Pope John Paul II appointed him as bishop of the diocese of Bridgeport, Connecticut. He served there until Pope Benedict XVI appointed him to Baltimore.

**As Archbishop of Baltimore, Archbishop Lori is responsible for the 150 parishes and numerous schools and charity agencies located in Baltimore City and the nine counties of central and western Maryland, stretching from Harford County in the East to Garrett County in the west and from the Pennsylvania line in the north to Anne Arundel and Howard counties in the south.** He is assisted by two auxiliary bishops, Bishops Rozanski and Madden, and a staff at the Catholic Center.

**Archbishop Lori's responsibilities include being** a member of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities and the Committee on Doctrine of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Archbishop is also the Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus. This means that he offers spiritual leadership and guidance to the national organization of the Knights.

We pray that the compassion of Christ and the wisdom of the Holy Spirit will guide Archbishop Lori in his important ministry as our episcopal shepherd.

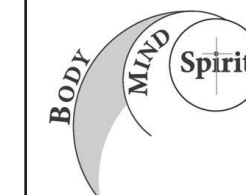


## Hunger Doesn't Go On Vacation!

## Armageddon

Today we heard "On that day the mourning in Jerusalem shall be as great as the mourning of Hadadrimmon in the plain of Megiddo." (Zechariah 12:11) Just what is "Hadadrimmon in the plain of Megiddo" and why is it significant?

One interpretation tells of the Kingdom of Judah, some 600 years before Jesus, suffering under the tyranny of the most wicked king in its history, King Manassah. Fortunately, his successor, Josiah, was the exact opposite and was most beloved. While still a young King, Josiah led his army against the invading Egyptians, and, on the plains of Megiddo near the city of Hadadrimmon, was killed and *the entire nation wept*.

People believed that the day would come when the power that gave Elijah victory over the forces of evil on Mount Carmel, near Megiddo, would defeat the forces that destroyed Josiah on the plains of Megiddo. This would be the day when the power of God, seen on the mountain, or in Hebrew, Har, would win the final victory for Megiddo. Leading this victory of good over evil would be the Messiah. This final confrontation would be called the battle of *Har Megiddo*, that is, ARMAGEDDON.
