Live Well Program Comes to Saint Margaret



"Behold, I make all things new." Rev. 21:5

"Living the Life for Which You Have Been Created" is a new Outreach project being developed through The Counseling Center at Stella Maris. Their goal and ours is for the greater good of this parish community: to guide each person through wellness to compassion and service to and for others. We all encounter crossroads throughout our life journey – and we all have crosses to bear. A healthy way to reconcile our personal struggles so that we can travel forward sometimes involves seeking professional help.

For the next school year, Stella Maris will be bringing The Counseling Center's expertise to the Saint Margaret campus. Starting in September, a counselor will be available on Tuesdays and Thursdays, daytime and early evening, to assist any parishioner age 5-105 with individual and/or family needs. Through individual sessions and/or monthly talks, community members will grow, heal, and increase in wellness and service to others, which will strengthen the church community (one body, many parts). Individual sessions will take place at the FiRE House located at 329 Wright Street to provide privacy and anonymity. The cost of each session will be determined on a sliding scale according to income, to a maximum of \$60/hr. However, this rate is at least half of what it would cost in other professional offices.

From Father Mike



Dear Friends,
I am touching on three topics today: the church project, priest celebrants for weekend Mass, and the RCIA.

First, I am happy to share that the major work on the church building is on schedule and on budget. As you know, the majority of what we are now doing involves major systems or infrastructure: the repair/replacement of the roof, of the air conditioning system, and of the heating system. The glass doorways of the building are also being replaced. Additionally, we are doing one piece of visible renovation/liturgical enhancement – the refinishing of the three large panels of wall that form the background to the sanctuary, including the installation of a large crucifix and the relocation of the image of the Risen Christ within the seating area of the church. While this renovation/liturgical enhancement will make a significant interior difference in our church, it comprises only about 10% of the current project cost of \$1.4 million.

So, we are on budget and should not exceed the \$1.4 million allotted. We have not been blindsided with any costly unknowns – thanks be to God! **We are also on schedule and expect the entire project to be finished so that we may re-open and return to the church on the weekend of September 13-14.** That is not yet final, so please watch for updates on this in the weeks ahead.

Beginning in next weekend's bulletin, August 23-24, we will be announcing the names of the priest celebrants for each of the Masses for the following weekend. A number of you have requested this and we will now begin to do this. The only caution is that sometimes changes in

scheduling are made out of necessity in the days right before the weekend. So, beginning August 23-24, you will find in the bulletin the schedule of Masses and the names of priest celebrants for the following weekend.

Our parish RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) program will begin once again in September.

This is a personal, engaging, and lively experience. There are presentations and discussions on all the core elements of Christianity and Catholicism. The Scripture and the living tradition of the Church down through the centuries are foundational. With these as a basis, we reflect upon our understanding of God, Jesus, Church, sacraments, Mass, prayer, personal and social morality, and much more.

Our parish Coordinator of Adult Faith Formation and a team of parishioners guide this entire experience.

The priests will also be involved at certain points. It is a custom-tailored, not a one-size-fits-all program. We look at each person's religious and faith background, identify what someone seeks and needs, and move from there. Our RCIA is intended for:

- Those exploring Catholicism with little or no faith background,
- Those baptized in other Christian denominations,
- Those who are Catholic and want a renewal or deepening of their faith.


